

The Hate U Give - Angie Thomas

BAME/Diversity/Family/Friendship/Human Rights/Bereavement

Age - Young Adult (YA) I would rate 14+

Sixteen-year-old Starr Carter lives in two worlds: the poor neighbourhood where she was born and raised and the fancy high school she attends. The uneasy balance between them is shattered when Starr witnesses the fatal shooting of her best friend Khalil by a police officer, he was unarmed. His death becomes a national headline and it sparks outrage across her community. Some people try to intimidate Starr and her family, the only person alive who knows what happened is Starr.
