

Adonis and Joseph at first seem to take an immediate dislike to each other but over the course of the story, their bonds deepen to a remarkable relationship.


Joseph has other battles with school, in particular bullying and his serious troubles with reading. Like so many children of his generation, his dyslexia is not recognised or understood.

This is a wonderful book; it is a beautifully written historical adventure story that will take readers on a very emotional and exciting journey. I absolutely loved it and can't recommend it enough.




Sora - CHS Online E and Audio Book Library

Recommended Reads on Sora


































This Issues Activity – The School Library
