AUTHOR VISIT IGNITES LOVE OF LITERACY

Crompton House came alive with excitement on Wednesday 2nd February as Year 7 students welcomed award-winning children's author Tom Palmer to school.

A popular name in the world of children's fiction, Tom has written of over 50 acclaimed books, with both sporting and historical themes. Yet students were surprised to learn of Tom's reluctance to read when he was at school, until his mum bought him a comic book about a topic he really loved – football. During his visit, Tom encouraged the youngsters to scour the library shelves for books on topics that appealed to them, to kick start their interest in literacy.

Some of his books centre around the events of the world wars, and are based on real life stories, with 'After The War' featuring the topic of the Holocaust – a theme students covered in school during recent commemorations for Holocaust Memorial Day.

As Tom spoke, a sea of hands spanned the room with

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY



Following a week of special assemblies for Holocaust Memorial Day, the Crompton House family took to Twitter to join the #LightTheDarkness campaign on Thursday 27th January.

Lighting candles at 8pm, we stood in solidarity with others across the country to remember those who were murdered in the Holocaust for who they were, and to stand against prejudice and hatred today.

All year groups participated in special assemblies prepared by the History Department, ahead of Holocaust Memorial Day. The theme to *Schindler's List*, was played by the Music Department as students entered the hall. Well done to Alex Brierley, Izaak Beck, Molly Mooney and Anita Okunde who spoke so well on such an emotional occasion. Together we remembered those who died and prayed for love to prevail over hate.

Mrs Cullen, Learning Zone Manager, who organised the event said:






GOING FOR GOLD!

After starring as the goody-two-shoes character, Flynn last year in the CBBC sketch show *Class Dismissed*, he was delighted to learn that the show has been nominated for not one, but two prestigious Comedy.co.uk Awards, run by the British Comedy Guide.

Harry and the cast of *Class Dismissed* now go head-to-head with other popular shows including *Horrible Histories*, *The Emily Atack Show*, *Have I Got News for You* and *Spitting Image* in the categories of Best Comedy Sketch Show and Comedy of The Year at this year's awards, as voted for by the public.

Filming the show on location through the summer holidays in 2021, Harry features in every episode of the hilarious six-part series, that aired last November. The comedy centres around the lives of pupils at the fictional Quayside Academy, as they grapple with everyday life at an extraordinary school full of even more extraordinary teachers.

Our team were gracious in defeat, immediately congratulating the opposition and showing immense maturity.

Student Niamh said:

"When the host announced we had won the first round of the competition, the atmosphere was sensational. Spirits were high, but we knew we had to take on board feedback and prepare for the second round. In the next debate, the competition was tough, but we held a strong argument and offered and accepted many POIs (points of information). We are proud of ourselves for making it this far with our first formal debate, and for having competed against such talented teams."

YEAR 11 SIXTH FORM TASTER DAY


On Thursday 27th January, the Year 11s took part in a taster day to find out more about life as a student at Crompton House Sixth Form.
