






# CHS Library Newsletter - Issue 43

# You Should See Me in a Crown

#### Fiction/Family/Friendship/LGBTQ+/Romance – Age 12+

Liz has always believed she's too black, too poor, too awkward to shine in her small, rich, prom-obsessed midwestern town. But it's okay -- Liz has a plan that will get her out of Campbell, Indiana, forever: attend the uber-elite Pennington College, play in their world-famous orchestra, and become a doctor.

But when the financial aid she was counting on unexpectedly falls through, Liz's plans come crashing down . . . until she's reminded of her school's scholarship for prom king and queen. There's nothing Liz wants to do less than endure a gauntlet of social media trolls, catty competitors, and humiliating public events, but despite her devastating fear of the spotlight she's willing to do whatever it takes to get to Pennington.

The only thing that makes it halfway bearable is the new girl in school, Mack. She's smart, funny, and just as much of an outsider as Liz. But Mack is also in the running for queen. Will falling for the competition keep Liz from her dreams . . . or make them come true?

The Danger Gang is about a boy named Franky Brown who has moved from sleepy Greyville to a mysterious village called Freaky. This book is written through a series of letters between the main character Franky and his best friend Dani, who he left behind when he moved house. Franky makes new friends, and everything seems normal on the surface, but strange things start to happen after a powerful storm and a flash of green lightening hit Freaky. It takes a group of children, working together as 'The Danger Gang', to defeat the evil that lies in Shadow Tech with some surprises on the way.

I really liked this book because it had great illustrations by Shane Devries, good humor, and moments of suspense. A great adventure book full of excitement! I rate this book 5/5.





# **Bookmark Competition**

# Women's History Month – March


