






















A YEAR OF SPORTING SUCCESS

It has been an outstanding year for sport at Crompton House School - with teams competing in a range of sports and competitions, resulting in many successes across the board.

All years (7-11) of the girls' football qualified for the Oldham Cup where they played at Boundary Park with each team becoming the Oldham Champions. Not only was this history for Crompton House, but they were also the first female footballers to play at Boundary Park. The Oldham Cup victories carried on with the Y9A and B boys and Sixth Form firsts, also being crowed Oldham Cup champions.

Crompton House were the overall winners at the Oldham Cross Country competition, where pupils from all years represented school. They also had a fantastic run in the Oldham Handball competition, with the girls U13's and U15's and the boys U15's, qualifying for the county handball tournament after winning in the first round of the regional tournament. The U13 girls had a phenomenal performance winning the Greater Manchester cricket tournament and competing in the county finals in Blackpool. The U12 boys were also runners up in the Oldham Cricket League after some fantastic performances against schools across the borough.

Our students have done exceedingly well and we are very proud of each and every one of them!



GIRLS LIGHT UP THE FLOOR AT DANGE WORLD GUP



Poppy Richardson (Y8) and Anabel Damyanova (Y7) danced their way back to CHS with a selection of medals and trophies from the Dance World Cup in San Sebastian, Spain.

As part of the Vale Studios team, Anabel participated in 12 group routines, winning five gold and two silver medals, plus two trophies for 'most outstanding group'. Poppy's groups placed 8th in the world for Song and Dance, Lyrical and Ballet and 10th in the world for Contemporary. She also won gold, silver and bronze medals across the board in various sections. All marks and medals were added to the overall team England score to secure Team England 1st place in the 2022 World Cup, with Spain coming 2nd.

What an achievement! Congratulations to both girls for competing in this intensive and challenging international event - all at Crompton House are very proud of you!



Lewis sails to international success

Congratulations to young sailor Lewis Bacon in Y9, who recently came 4th in a National Sailing event out of 88 competitors across the UK. He is now seeded 9th overall in the UK in the National Series. Earlier in the year he was selected to represent the North region and to train with the youth Topper squad at Weymouth with lead coach and Olympic/Paralympic medallist Helena Lucas. Lewis participated in The Eric Twiname Junior Championships in May where he ranked 8th overall out of 110 sailors in his class, attaining 11th place/10th place/2nd place and 1st place, which put him in the gold fleet. This month Lewis will be part of a team of sailors representing the UK in the World Topper Championships in Italy. Good luck Lewis and team - we continue to be inspired by your fantastic achievements!
