






# CHS Library Newsletter – Issue 49

The sea carries our pain. The stars carry our future.


Natalie's world is falling apart. She's just lost her mum and her brother marches the streets of Dover full of hate and anger. Swimming is her only refuge.

# Manjeet Mann – Author Visit

On the 28<sup>th</sup> of April we were visit by award winning writer Manjeet Mann, author of verse novels Run Rebel and The Crossing the later featured above. Manjeet is a fabulous diverse writer and actor who writes about different cultures, empathy, bullying and very real-life issues such as the ongoing refugee crisis. Manjeet is also the founder of Run the World charity – an organisation that works with women and girls from marginalized backgrounds and helps to empower them through sport and storytelling. Manjeet spoke with our year 8, 9 and 10, she talked to students about what inspires her stories, engaging and encouraging creative writing and the benefits that reading brings whilst encouraging our young people to follow their dreams. 


### Refugee Week – 19th – 25th June
