Becoming future ready	Personal Skills: People with language skills and knowledge are highly thought of in the modern world. They stand out as talented and successful people, with broad and exciting horizons. Learning a language means you add an extra dimension to your personal skills profile: a language GCSE on your CV impresses employers; it shows you have developed an excellent range of communication and thinking skills; your ability to analyse and interpret information will be stronger and your knowledge and application of the grammar of English is often enhanced. Employability: You will be in a stronger position to find work with companies abroad or for companies in the UK with international links	
Adaptation	Throughout this topic, quality first teaching will provide differentiation:	
QFT/SEND Provision	By product: different learners are asked to present outcomes in a different way via pieces of writing, models and drawings, a voice recording, a song, a drama presentation etc. By resource: readability to be improved for example, by using a predominance of one or two syllable words, simple sentences, connectives to guide the reader through the text etc. Worksheets are clearly presented and accessible. Instructions are clearly outlined and separate from the information so that pupils know where to begin and end. Class texts are supplemented or replaced with appropriate differentiated texts. Resources used will appeal to the range of preferred learning styles of pupils e.g. visual, auditory or kinesthetic learners. By Intervention: by providing different levels of supervision and support By Progressive Questioning: exploring pupils' understanding through interactive dialogue. By Grouping: according to prior attainment, gender, social preference, preferred learning style. By Task: Pupils should be involved in the identification of targets which are meaningful to them and in the selection of an appropriate task from the given range. By Offering Optional Activities: In class or as homework, to extend learning. This QFT/SEND provision will be explicit within the lesson by lesson schemes of work.
