Our Historians Visited Berlin



It has been an exciting December for our talented Year 11 historians who undertook a four day exploration of Berlin, weaving together history, culture, and festive fun.

After months of preparation by our History Department, the journey commenced on the 8th with a smooth flight from Manchester Airport followed by an evening at Alex am Berlin restaurant, sampling the culture and setting the tone for an exciting adventure.

The first full day featured a morning shopping spree at the Mall of Berlin and a poignant walking tour, where students engaged with Berlin's historical landmarks such as Checkpoint Charlie, Hitler's bunker and the Memorial to the Holocaust.

Day three delved into history with eye opening visits to Sachsenhausen concentration camp and the Wannsee Conference House. Despite the solemnity, the day concluded with a visit to the Christmas markets, infusing historical reflection with light-hearted moments.

On the fourth day our team visited Hohenschonhausen Stasi prison, revealing East Germany's dark past.

Throughout the trip, students demonstrated commendable behaviour and were credit to the school, despite a few tram shenanigans!

Year 12s' Super Learning Day


It has also been an action packed month for our Year 12 students who took part in a Super Learning Day.

The Mayor of Manchester has set up the GMACs scheme to help inform young people about apprentice opportunities in Greater Manchester.

I saw the pressures staff were constantly under on a daily basis, how communication works in a hospital setting, and how the hospital is generally run. I'm very grateful for this opportunity."






























Best Wishes Julie!
